

About the Grapple Bucket Attachment

The grapple bucket attachment is intended for use in materials handling. The primary use of the grapple bucket attachment includes land clearing, landscaping, demolition, construction, and grounds maintenance. Use of this equipment in any other manner is considered to be contrary to the intended use of the attachment.

Grapple Buckets

The grapple bucket is quickly becoming a necessity among all contractors today. This unique grapple bucket is offered in a variety of sizes for a variety of applications.

The Severe Duty Grapple Bucket attachment combines the loading and leveling actions of a skid steer bucket with the "grabbing ability" of two hydraulic grapples. The basic design of the grapple bucket attachment allows it to load and grapple large and/or uneven objects. The bucket is also designed to pick up the smallest debris. Our grapple buckets feature enclosed cylinders and hoses to protect against debris and stray limbs. The depth of the bucket has been increased, giving it a large loading capacity and the reinforced ribbed bottom reduces bowing and wear of the grapple bucket. The Severe Duty grapple bucket also has removable sides for optional increased volume of smaller debris. With our new design you will have an unobstructed view of the materials entering and exiting the skid steer attachment. No other skid steer grapple bucket attachment on the market provides these essential features.

The grapple bucket is available in 5 sizes: 60", 66", 72", 78", and 84"!

2. Safety

2.1 General Safety Information



This **SAFETY ALERT SYMBOL** identifies important safety messages on the equipment and in the owner's manual. When you see this symbol, be alert to the possibility of personal injury and carefully read the message that follows.

🛕 IMPORTANT 🛕

The signal word **IMPORTANT** identifies procedures which must be followed to avoid damage to the machine.



DANGER

The signal word **DANGER** on the machine and in the manuals indicates a hazardous situation which, if not avoided, will result in death or serious injury.



WARNING



The signal word **WARNING** on the machine and in the manuals indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, could result in death or serious injury.

CAUTION



The signal word **CAUTION** on the machine and in the manuals indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, may result in minor or moderate injury. It may also be used to alert against unsafe practices.

NOTE: Notes are used to indicate important information. This information may be repeated in other areas of the manual.

Terminology

Prime Mover: The grapple bucket can be attached to many different pieces of equipment; therefore, the term "prime mover" will be used. A prime mover is any equipment, tractor, or skid steer providing power to the attachment.

Operating Safety

- Read and follow instructions in this manual and the machine's Operators Manual before operating.
- The manual must always remain with the machine. In case of loss or damage, request a new copy from your dealer or from Blue Diamond.
- Only qualified and trained operators should operate, maintain, and service this attachment.
 See section 2.2 on page 7 to determine a qualified operator.
- Strictly follow all rules prescribed by the safety pictograms/decals applied to the machine.
 Ensure that all safety pictograms/decals are legible. If pictograms/decals are worn, they must be replaced with new ones obtained from Blue Diamond and placed in the position indicated by this manual.
- Before using the machine, make sure that all safety devices are installed and in good working conditions. In case of damaged or missing shields, replace them immediately.
- It is absolutely forbidden to remove or alter safety devices and/or safety precautions
- Pay maximum attention to avoid any accidental contact with rotating parts of the machine.
- If the use of the machine is required at night or in conditions of reduced visibility, use the lighting system of the prime mover and possibly an auxiliary lighting system.

Modifications to Equipment

Any modifications made to this equipment may void any warranty and relieve the manufacturer of liability of any resulting injury or damage.

2. Safety

2.2 Qualified Operators

Qualified Operators

The operator is a person suited to the work and who is physically and psychologically able to withstand the demands connected with operating the equipment for its intended use. The operator must not allow anyone to approach the machine while it is working and must not allow external personnel to operate the machine or attachment.

He is to follow the given instructions in this manual and the machine operator's manual in order to obtain maximum performance, minimum consumption, and maximum safety for himself and for others.

The operator is responsible for scrupulously observing all the instructions given in this manual.

AVOID SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH

Operators must receive instructions before operating the machine. Untrained operators can cause serious injury or death.

For an operator to be qualified, he or she must not use drugs or alcoholic drinks which impair alertness or coordination while working. An operator who is taking prescription drugs must get medical advice to determine if he or she can safely operate a machine and the equipment. For an operator to be qualified, he or she must have read and understood the instructions of this manual, he or she must make adequate preparation for the proper use of the machine, and he or she must hold a driving license.

In case of doubt regarding the use of the machine and/or the interpretation of this manual, the operator must contact either their dealer or Blue Diamond.

Operator Training

- Check the rules and regulations at your location. The rules may include an employer's work safety requirements. Regulations may apply to local driving requirements or use of a Slow Moving Vehicle (SMV) emblem. Regulations may identify a hazard such as a utility line.
- The new operator must start in an area without bystanders and use all the controls until he or she can operate the machine safely under all conditions of the work area.

Operator Safety

- It is the responsibility of the operator to follow all local, state, and federal safety regulations. Improper use of this equipment may result in personal injury, property damage, and/or damage to the equipment.
- Before starting, and during operation of the attachment, make sure there are no people or animals in the operation area; the machine can project material from the back with risks of serious injury or death.
- During operation, adjustment, maintenance, repairing, or transportation of the machine, the operator must always use appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) including but not limited to safety glasses, working gloves, dustmask, safety helmet, and hearing protection.

NOTE: Additional safety equipment may be required depending on the operating environment and worksite conditions.

- Do not operate the attachment or machine while wearing loose fitting clothing that can be entangled or caught in parts of the machine.
- Do not operate the implement when tired, not in good health condition, or under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

3. Operation

3.1 Entering and Exiting the Prime Mover



See the machine's Operator's Manual for detailed information on operating the loader.

Entering the Operator's Position

Use the attachment safety treads, handles and steps (on the machine) to enter the operator's position.

When in the operator's position, lower safety seat bar, start the engine and release the parking brake.

Leaving the Operator's Position



AVOID SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH

- Always park on a flat level surface.
- Place attachment flat on the ground.
- Place all controls in NEUTRAL.
- Engage the park brake.
- Stop the engine and remove the key.
- Wait for all moving parts to stop.
- SEE MACHINE'S OPERATOR'S MANUAL FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION.

Park the machine/attachment on a flat level surface.

Place all controls in neutral, engage the park brake, stop the engine and wait for all moving parts to stop. Leave the operator's position.

3.2 Attachment Installation

Connecting Attachment To The Prime Mover

NOTE: Before attempting to attach the grapple bucket to the prime mover, verify that all hydraulic couplings are compatible.







Improper attachment to the prime mover may cause personal injury.





All hydraulic connections must be clean and free of debris before making any connection.

- 1. Place the grapple bucket attachment on a level surface.
- 2. Position the prime mover facing the attachment close to the mount.
- 3. Insert and connect the prime mover into the attachment.
- 4. Connect the hydraulic lines from the attachment to the prime mover.
- 5. Close latches (or other locking mechanism) to secure the attachment to the prime mover.





AVOID SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH

The locking mechanism must extend through the holes in the attachment mounting frame. Failure to secure locking mechanism can allow attachment to come off.

3.2 Attachment Installation Cont'd

Connecting Attachment to the Prime Mover Cont'd

6. Using the prime mover, raise the attachment and move the attachment to ensure hydraulic lines are clear of air and operate properly.





Hydraulics should operate in an even and smooth manner. Hydraulic movement that is not even and smooth may indicate that air is in the hydraulic lines.

- 7. Lower the attachment to ground level
- Inspect that the attachment is mounted properly and securely. If the attachment does not meet this requirement, follow the instructions to remove the grapple bucket and re-attach using the instructions above.

Disconnecting Attachment From the Machine



Improper disconnection from the prime mover may cause personal injury or damage to the attachment and prime mover.



All hydraulic connections must be clean and free of debris before making any disconnection.

- 1. Using the prime mover, lower the attachment to the ground.
- 2. To prevent contamination, remove any dirt and debris from the couplings. Disconnect the hydraulic connection between the attachment and the prime mover.

NOTE: Hydraulic connections must be disconnected before disengaging latches to prevent damage to the prime mover or the attachment.

- 3. Disengage the prime mover latches (or other locking mechanism) from the attachment.
- 4. Move the prime mover away from the attachment.

4. Inspections and Maintenance

4.1 Equipment Inspection

It is recommended to inspect the equipment for damage and wear before use. Use the following list as a guideline during equipment inspection.

- Check all hardware connections to the prime mover for damage or fatigue such as cracks or other structural flaws.
- Check that all latches or locks are closed.
- Check that all hydraulic fittings are tight and free of leaks.
- Check that all hydraulic lines are free of leaks, holes, or cracks.



Leaking fluids under pressure can enter the skin and cause serious injury or death. Immediate medical attention is required. Wear goggles. Use cardboard to check for leaks.

• Check that the tires on the prime mover are in good condition and have proper load ratings.

NOTE: Replace any damaged hardware, hoses, and fittings before using the equipment.

4.2 Usage Guidelines

Before each use do the following:

- Perform the equipment inspection by performing a walk around.
- Perform daily inspection as indicated in the Inspection Checklist found in section 4.4 on page 11.
- Verify that the proper attachment is being used for the task. Use the grapple bucket for materials handling only.



Keep all body parts away from the grapple bucket when in use. The upper tines may open or close unexpectedly causing serious bodily injury or death.

Inspect the grapple bucket daily before use. It is also recommended to inspect the grapple bucket after extreme use or damage. Use the following inspection checklist as a guideline.

4. Inspections and Maintenance

4.3 Lubrication Points

Grease all pivot points every 8 hours of use to prevent excess wear on the pins. The Severe Duty Grapple Bucket has 8 grease points. These 8 points are circled below in Figure 1.






4.4 Inspection Checklist

	ITEMS
\checkmark	Are all safety notices and warning stickers in proper locations and visible?
\checkmark	Are there any visible hydraulic leaks?
\checkmark	Are any cracks visible in the grapple bucket structure?
\checkmark	Are the tines worn or bent?
\checkmark	Have all grease fittings (zerk fittings) been greased?
\checkmark	Are the bolts holding pins secure and tight?
\checkmark	Has the prime mover been properly inpected for hydraulic leaks and proper tire inflation?
\checkmark	Has the prime mover been properly maintained?


